If no end date is given, the first date is displayed in the Place table (http://openatlas-dev.craws.net/admin/place)	
To be exactly: the second part of the first date is used for the last date. e.g.: Benin (http://openatlas-dev.craws.net/admin/place/view/id/355) is first mentioned between 1001 and 1300. The Place table shows the First date as 1001 and the Last date as 1300.

Yes, this is intentional. For performance reasons in list views the earliest and latest date is displayed. That's why they are labeled first and last instead of begin and end like in the form.

Anyway, good observation, it could have been unintentional and a sign for an underlying bug.
